The semester fee

What is the money used for?

Students have to pay a semester fee. In Hanover, depending on the university, this is between 350 and 420 Euros. But what is it actually for?

The Studentenwerk receives around a quarter of the semester fee. Through this contribution, students take part in funding our social services, which range from inexpensive canteen meals and free social counselling to affordable student housing and more.

The AStA of the respective university is your political representation. The AStA (student union) adovocates interests for the students towards the university administration and offers services. Included in most AStA fees: Theatre flat rate and and a cooperation for low-cost bicycle repairs.

How is the Studentenwerk financed beyond that?



Your fees only contribute to about a quarter of the Studentenwerk's income. Most of our income is generated by revenue from canteens and cafeterias and rental income from student housing. Just under 20 per cent is received in the form of financial aid and as a reimbursement for BAföG administration from the state of Lower Saxony.

Pay once, get on and go: More than half of the semester fee is for the semester ticket.
In return, you can use all trams and buses in Hanover and almost all local trains in the whole of Lower Saxony and Bremen for six months. You can find out more from your AStA and at dein-semesterticket.de.

The smallest part goes to other costs. This includes, for example, the cultural tickets or the bicycle workshops.

BAföG & more

How much does it cost to study?

Rent, food, telephone, internet, leisure activities, books and other things for university - studying is costly. It is not easy to keep track, especially when you have moved out of home and are standing on your own two feet for the first time.

On average, you need about 1000 Euros a month for your studies. Whether you can get by with less or need more depends on you, of course.

We offer free and confidential counselling on BAföG, scholarships, student loans and general questions about your finances for your studies.

BAföG

BAföG is the most favourable way to finance your studies, if you are entitled to it. No matter how much BAföG you receive, half of it is free. The other half is an interest-free (!) loan. You have to repay the loan after five years after finishing your studies - but BAföG has a built-in debt brake. You never have to repay more than 10,010 euros. And you have 20 years to do so! Doesn't sound so bad, does it? Try it out!

To keep you fit and energetic during your study week, we make sure to offer balanced meals as often as possible that do not contain any highly processed foods or convenience products and have a maximum of 800 calories. Just look for the »Healthy & Cheerful« label on the menu.

Fancy a dessert? You can get one every day in our »Sweet Corner«.

Or would you rather have schnitzel, pizza, curry sausage or bowls? All of these are available every day at the »Evergreens«.

Sustainability

The environment and sustainability are important to us. Therefore

- we produce our own food from mainly fresh ingredients
- we use regional suppliers wherever possible (For example, we buy our fresh meat exclusively from regional butchers.)
- 60 percent of our cafeteria food is now vegan or vegetarian
- we offer the KlimaTeller daily
- we offer oat milk as an alternative for coffee and and coffee specialities
- we avoid food waste as much as possible
- we serve food and hot beverages to go almost exclusively in reusable deposit containers
- we offer our bread rolls exclusively unpackaged

In our canteens and cafeterias, you generally pay by card, namely with the university chip card. You can recharge your card at the cash or EC card desk. If you do not have a university chip card with payment function, simply get a free MensaCard or pay with your smartphone, EC or credit card.
